**INTRODUCTION**

The Florence M. Cronise Papers consist of two large diary-scrapbooks given to the Center for the Evangelical United Brethren Heritage by Florence Norris of Albion, Michigan.

**BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE**

Florence M. Cronise was born in Newark, New York. She was educated in Rochester, New York, and at LaSell Seminary, Auburn, Massachusetts. Ms Cronise was a United Brethren missionary and English teacher who worked in the United States, Sierra Leone, and Japan. Her career as an educator included teaching and/or administrative positions at Earlham College, Otterbein College, Western (Leander Clark) College, and Nagoya College.

**SCOPE AND CONTENT**

The two diary-scrapbooks in HC-63 are filled with newspaper and magazine articles, photographs, post cards, and personal hand-written reflections documenting Ms Cronise’s travels to and missionary work in Japan, 1913-20.
